By Car

- From New Chitose Airport, take the Hokkaido Expressway via Kitahiroshima IC (approx. 48 min)
- From JR Sapporo Station, take route 36, via Fukuzumi-Soen-dori Street (approx. 30 min)

By Bus

- From Fukuzumi Station on the Subway Toho Line, take [Fuku 84, Hitsujigaoka Line] (approx. 12 min)
- From JR Sapporo Station (Tokyu Dept. Store South Exit) take No. [89, Hitsujigaoka Line] (approx. 38 min)
